David Carpenter is professor of medieval history at King's College London and a leading authority on the history of Britain in the Middle Ages. He has published a new book, *Magna Carta*, in the Penguin Classics series.

Lecture: From title deeds to Magna Carta: how medieval charters changed the world Nicholas Vincent

Nicholas Vincent is professor of medieval history at the University of East Anglia and a fellow of the British Academy. He heads the Arts and Humanities Research Council 'Magna Carta Project', several of whose findings have been reported in the national newspapers.
