Resources accessible at the Royal College of Physicians (RCP) and online

Onsite Wi-fi and internet access

There is free public wi-fi in the RCP's building at 11 St Andrews Place (11 SAP), including in the research study space in the 2nd floor reading room. There is also a PC with internet connection in the study space.

Catalogues

The catalogues for all RCP historical collections are fully searchable online. They contain descriptions of the items and objects in the archive, heritage library and museum services (AMS) holdings. Onsite free access to digital content

One third of the archive collection (c.10,000 items) and a small part of the library collection (c.7,000 volumes) have been fully digitised to create online copies. This site contains many resources on the history of the RCP, and the medical profession, including:

- A timeline for the development of the medical professions over the last 500 years
- Our <u>blog</u> which tells the stories behind our collections and displays

The site also contains full digital surrogates of some of our unique and fragile manuscripts and books:

- The Wilton Psalter, an illuminated psalter (copy of the biblical book of psalms) dating from c.1300. <u>https://history.rcplondon.ac.uk/book1</u>
- *Regimen Sanitatis Salerni* (The Salernitan Rule of Health), a medieval medical text written in Latin, c.1300-1400. This work was translated into every European language and used as a medical text for over 500 years.
