





COLA HIGHGATE HILL VISIT TO ROYAL COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS

A group of eight Year 12 students from City of London

Academy Highgate Hill visited the Royal College of Physicians
for a careers-focused museum visit on 23 May 2023. The aim
of the visit was to use the RCP's historic collections to inspire
and educate pupils about careers in medicine.

VISIT TO THE ROYAL COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS

The students were taken on an interactive tour of the museum by Archivist Felix, and were shown various exhibitions while discussing and learning about the history of medicine. The students also took part in an activity in which they were provided with character profiles for a selection of physicians, and in groups they discussed the attributes, skills and knowledge that the physicians would require, as well as what inspires and motivates them. They also had to match various items of medical equipment to the relevant physician. Some of the skills and attributes that the students identified as important for the physicians were: patience, confidence, communication, flexibility and resilience.

STUDENT EXPERIENCE

The students were actively engaged in the museum tour and asked relevant questions. They enjoyed having a close look at the medical equipment and testing it out. I spoke to two students, Dominic and Ream about their thoughts on the session. Both enjoyed learning about the history of medicine and how it has evolved through the years. They particularly



enjoyed being hands on with the medical world including getting to explore medical equipment and even looking at human remains to see the structure of veins!
